

The Joan and Robert Huntley Art History Scholarship

Description

The Joan and Robert Huntley Art History Scholarship offers the opportunity to do research involving the collections and resources of both the Ackland Art Museum and the North Carolina Museum of Art (art, archive, and library resources, and professional expertise). The Huntley Scholar will work on a research project to be determined in consultation with the Ackland and NCMA staff. The 2022 Huntley Scholar will work on a non-exhibition research project.

Eligibility

Art History graduate students at any level in the Department of Art and Art History at UNC-Chapel Hill are eligible to apply for this Scholarship.

Term

Summer 2022; dates TBD, 320 hours total.

Award

\$7,500 stipend

Up to \$1,000 in travel or other research expenses

Application Due 5:00 PM, February 1, 2022

Applications should be submitted electronically and should include:

A statement of no more than two typed pages explaining the applicant's interest in the position and relevant background and skills and, if possible, indicating proposed areas of topics of research.

A curriculum vitae

The Ackland Art Museum will announce the selected candidate. Selection is based on the applicant's qualifications and on the likelihood of the applicants' benefiting from the Scholarship.
